

South Korea (Seoul) Study Tour

(27 to 31 March 2026)

With the lead of Assistant Principal KWAN Ki-shun, Ms CHAN Cheuk-yu and Mr. TSANG Hing-pong, our S2 to S5 students successfully completed the 5-day South Korea (Seoul) Study Tour from 27 March (Friday) to 31 March 2026 (Tuesday). The study tour aimed to allow students learning outside the classroom to gain an on-site understanding of South Korea's rapid development and conservation achievements in various aspects, including history and culture, natural environment and innovative technology. Through hands-on experience and observations, students broadened their international horizons and cultivated the ability to think in multiple angles to become citizens of global perspectives.

During the intensive and fulfilling 5-day journey, students demonstrated a strong interest in learning. In the fields of innovative technology and environmental protection, students visited the Citizen Safety Experience Centre, the Samsung Innovation Museum, the Seoul Robot & AI Museum (RAIM) and Seoul Upcycling Plaza. In the Citizen Safety Experience Centre, students learned practical disaster prevention and self-rescue knowledge through simulated disaster scenarios and experienced how to respond to natural disasters. Through various interactive experiences and exhibitions, students not only recognized South Korea's leading position in artificial intelligence and electronic technology, but also deeply reflected on the importance of sustainable development and environmental waste reduction to the future of the city from the operation of the Upcycling Plaza. Students actively asked questions and compared with Hong Kong's environmental policies and waste reduction measures. They engaged in in-depth discussion during visits and demonstrated their concern for current social issues.

Besides rapidly evolving technology, South Korea's preservation of traditional culture also left a deep impression on students. They visited Gyeongbokgung Palace, the Cheonggyecheon Museum, the National Folk Museum of Korea, Namsangol Hanok Village and ascended N Seoul Tower to overlook the cityscape. Among them, the revitalization project of Cheonggyecheon allowed students to witness a successful paradigm of the coexistence of urban development and natural ecology, which was deeply impressive. In addition, students visited the KBS broadcasting station to understand the booming local film and television industry. They experienced the youthful vitality of the Hongdae Art District and enjoyed the renowned and rhythmic NANTA SHOW. On the last day of the journey, students participated in a Hanbok experience and traditional Korean Gimbap making. Wandering through ancient buildings and making authentic food with their own hands, students fully experienced the uniqueness of South Korea's blend of ancient and modern times in these dynamic and static activities, creating lasting and cherished memories of this multifaceted educational journey.
